Medical presentation at Leon County Library

A presentation by Dr. Ken Brummel-Smith, M.D., "How U.S. Medical Care is Making Us Sicker and Poorer," will be held from 3 to 5 p.m. July 21 at the Leon County Library. This presentation is free and held by Center for Inquiry Tallahassee. Dr. Brummel-Smith is the head of the Department of Geriatrics at Florida State's College of Medicine and has served as President of the American Geriatrics Society. He will be discussing the vast number of medical errors that occur in the nation each year, despite the quality of the skilled physicians, and the expenses attached to what may be useless or harmful procedures.

Smoke tests should improve sewer lines

The City of Tallahassee's Underground Utilities will begin smoke tests Monday to locate leaks in the sewer system. Vegetable oil-derived smoke will be sent through the sewer lines so city crews can identify where the smoke escapes. This process is safe to people, plants and animals, and the smoke is not expected to enter homes. The first phase beginning Monday will take place in Settler's Springs, later moving to the area of West Tennessee and West Tharpe streets.
